



Rules and Guidelines

Camp Voyageur's rules and guidelines are involved to ensure the health and the safety of all participants, and to allow them to have fun during the camp.

1. Arrivals and departures

Transportation will be provided by professional bus charter from the following pick-up points (for departures and returns) :

- Saskatoon
- Regina

Schedule time of transport will be sent to you by email. To be sure to be on time, we ask you to arrive 15 minutes before your schedule time.

We will have staff members in the bus during all travel.

We ask you to provide lunch or snacks for the travel to the camp. We will provide it for the return trips.

If you prefer to come drop-off the camper at the Camp Voyageur site, you need to arrive between 3:30 and 5:30 PM at École Mathieu in Gravelbourg (306, 1st avenue East). You must meet the camp coordinator at a specific meeting point.

If you prefer to come pick-up your camper at the Camp Voyageur site, you need to arrive between 11:00 and 12:00 AM at École Mathieu in Gravelbourg (306, 1st avenue East). You must meet the camp coordinator at the specific meeting point.

Note:

- Food with nuts and peanuts are not allowed.
- Glass bottles are not allowed.

2. Supervision and discipline

Supervision is provided during all activities, including qualified lifeguards on duty during all aquatic activities.

We will always have a ratio of one supervisor for nine kids.

All staff member will have followed one week training including first-aid and CPR. We also will have a criminal record check for each person who will be working for the camp.

Aggressive or offensive language will not be tolerated, Parents/tutors will be contacted if necessary and if the situation can't be fixed, the participant may be sent back home. All fees will be at the charge of the participant and their family.

Cellphones, Ipods, videogames, and any electronic devices, which are not essential for the participant's health, is not allowed at the camp. If our supervisors find something, they will take it until the end of the camp. The camp is also not responsible for lost or stolen items.



Food from home is not allowed, except for special medical condition. Parent/tutor has to let the coordinator know.

Campers can get homesick the first few days, however, usually do well thereafter. Visits or phone calls are not allowed as to not interfere with the camp activities. Parents will be notified if necessary. Any inquiries should be directed to the camp coordinator.

We consider age as of December 31. This means you may register your child in a camp if they will reach the age requirement by December 31, 2020. When requested, special permissions may be given for children of 5 and 15 years old.

No drugs or alcohol is tolerated at the Camp Voyageur. Camp Voyageur reserves the right to dismiss any camper who is deemed a hazard to the safety and rights of other campers or staff due to unacceptable behaviour or attitudes, or who appears to have rejected the reasonable expectations of the camp.

Note :

The only language used at the camp is French. Every participant must follow this essential rule.

3. Medical care

All medication has to be dropped to the camp coordinator with prescription (including dose and when your kids must take it) upon arrival.

No regular medication will be given without prescription.

The camp coordinator could provide basic medication such as Tylenol, cough syrup, Band-Aids, etc....

Although we take every reasonable precaution to avoid accidents, incidents sometimes happen. In the case a participant requires additional medical attention, the camp coordinator will arrange for special services and notify the parent(s)/guardian(s) as soon as possible. Additional expenses that may result from such services, which are not covered by our insurance, are the responsibility of the parent(s)/guardian(s).

Note :

If the health conditions of your child change between registration and the beginning of the camp, please let us know as soon as you can.

4. Food

A well-balanced diet is provided to all participants and we guarantee a peanut-free environment. Do not send food, drinks or candy to camp with your child. A refillable water-bottle will be provided to your camper.

5. Items that you have to leave at home

We ask parent(s)/guardian(s) to be sure that your camper leaves these items at home:

- Cellphone
- Money



- Video games
- IPod, IPad, Mp3
- Food (except for the travel)
- Knives or any dangerous objects
- Water bottles

Those items will be immediately taken by supervisor and parent(s)/guardian(s) will be contacted.

6. Refund policy

All cancellation has to be done by email, mail or fax:

- Before May 31, all registration fees will be refunded
- Before June 30, half of registration fees will be refunded
- After July 1st, we will not do a registration fee refund.

Refunds are not available for participant arriving late, leaving early or for participant dismissed due to disciplinary action.

In the case where the camp must be cancelled, all funds will be fully reimbursed.
