



Rules and Guidelines

Winter's Camp Voyageur's rules and guidelines are involved to insure the health and the safety of all participants, and to allow them to have fun during the camp.

1. Arrivals and departures

Transportation to the camp will be done with two small buses driven by camp Voyageur's staff members. Regina and Saskatoon will be the two locations for arrivals and departures.

Schedule time of transport will be sent to you by email. To be sure to be on time, we ask you to arrive 15 minutes before your schedule time.

We ask you to provide lunch or snacks for the travel to the camp. We will provide it for the come-back travel.

If you prefer to come for arrival with your kid to the Camp Voyageur site, you need to arrive between noon and 2:00 PM at the camp site (You will find below the directions). You will have to meet the camp director.

If you prefer to pick up your kid directly to the Camp Voyageur site, you need to arrive between noon and 2:00 PM at the camp site (You will find below the directions). You will have to meet the camp director.

Note:

- Food with nuts and peanuts is not allowed.
- Glass bottle is not allowed.

2. Supervision and discipline

Supervision is provided during all activities.

We will always have a ratio of one supervisor for nine kids.

All staff member will have followed a training including first-aids and RCR. We will also have a criminal record check of each person who will be in the camp.

Aggressive or offensive language will not be tolerated, Parents/tutors will be contacted if necessary and if the situation can't be fixed, participant may be sent back home. All fees will be at the charge of the participant and his family.

Cellphone, Ipod, videogames, or any electronic device, which is not essential for the participant's health, is not allowed for the camp. If our supervisors find something, they will take it until the end of the camp.



Food from home is not allowed, except for special medical condition. Parent/tutor has to let the camp's director know.

Campers can get homesick the first few days, however, usually do well thereafter. Visits or phone calls are not allowed so as not to interfere with camp activities. Parents will be notified if necessary. Any inquiries should be directed to camp director. Twice a day, news from campers will be posted on the Camp Voyageur website and facebook page.

No drugs or alcohol is tolerated at the Camp Voyageur. Camp Voyageur reserves the right to dismiss any camper who is deemed a hazard to the safety and rights of other campers or staff due to unacceptable behaviour or attitudes, or who appears to have rejected the reasonable expectations of the camp.

Note :

The unique language for the camp is French. Every participant has to follow this essential rule.

3. Medical care

All medication has to be dropped to the camp director with prescription (including dose and when your kids has to take it) at the departure.

No regular medication will be given without prescription.

Camp director could provide basic medication such as Tylenol, cough syrup, Band-Aids, etc....

Although we take every reasonable precaution to avoid accidents, incidents sometimes happen. In the case a participant requires additional medical attention, the camp director will arrange for special services and notify the parent(s)/guardian(s) as soon as possible. Additional expenses that may result from such services, which are not covered by our insurance, are the responsibility of the parent(s)/guardian(s).

Note :

If the health conditions of your child change between registration and the beginning of the camp, please let us know as soon as you can.

4. Food

Participants will be in charge of planning the meals and cooking. The objective is to raise children's awareness among healthy food and make them want to cook. They will be helped by our team who will look after balanced diet and will support participants with cooking.

Do not send food, drinks or candy to camp with your child. Refill water-bottle will be provided to your kid.



5. Items that you have to leave at home

We ask parent(s)/guardian(s) to be sure that your kid leave at home those items:

- Cellphone
- Video games
- IPod, IPad, Mp3
- Food (except for the travel)
- Money
- Knives or any dangerous object
- Water bottle

Those items will be immediately taken by supervisor and parent(s)/guardian(s) will be contacted.

6. Refund policy

All cancellation has to be done by email, mail or fax:

- Before January 1st, all registration fees will be refunded
- Before February 1st, half of registration fees will be refunded
- After February 1st, half of registration fees will be refunded if we can find another family to buy the spot. If that's not possible, none of the registration fees will be refunded.

Refunds are not available for participant arriving late, leaving early or for participant dismissed due to disciplinary action
